<ul> <li>→ 1909 – 16 Iona Rd. Audenville (mother an Auden)</li> <li>→ Manager &amp; Accountant Independent Newspapers</li> </ul>	Audenville
<ul> <li>→ Gordon born 1889</li> <li>→ Doctor &gt;&gt; Dublin Metropolitan School of Art (prec NCAD)</li> </ul>	Gordon
<ul> <li>→ By 1906 in Indo &amp; rose Chief Cartoonist &amp; Head Art. Dept.</li> <li>→ Checkout – Seán Citizen in many of his cartoons</li> <li>→ 1926 married Marie Elizabeth Burfoot from North Strand</li> <li>→ Met via Yeats family: Gordon friend of Jack B; Marie's mother took tea with the Yeats sisters. Asked if he would teach her to draw.</li> <li>→ Converted to Roman Catholicism</li> <li>→ Two children (Dolores 1929 and Richard 1931)</li> <li>→ Marriage broke up in early 1930s &amp; Marie went to England</li> </ul>	Desk
